# Early Childhood Education Major Transfer Plan for: Kirkwood Community College

#### Abstract

The Early Childhood Education-Unified (ECE) curriculum leads to recommendation for a state of Iowa teaching license that will allow you to teach children from birth through third grade, in both general and special education, and to work with families of young children. *Students interested in the non-licensure early childhood career options should follow the Child Development and Guidance option within the Human Development and Family Studies (HDFS) major, or Early Childcare Education and Programming (ECP).


## HOW TO READ THIS TRANSFER PLAN

This guide is designed for students to see how courses taken at a community college will transfer to Iowa State and within the Early Childhood Education-Unified major. On the left side, the "Iowa State University Course" is listed and on the right side, the exact match (course equivalent) is shown. If the right side says "Complete at ISU", the student will need to complete the course at Iowa State University; if the right side says "See list of options on following page", the student will need to choose from the options listed for that category of courses on pages 3 and 4 .

## This transfer plan has $\underline{2}$ parts

1. General Education courses for the ECE major. (Note: an AA/AS degree does not satisfy this requirement. Iowa State will review each course.)
2. Required Classes for the ECE Major
*2 years of high school foreign language or 2 semesters of college foreign language is required for the ECE program. Students may choose to complete this requirement in high school, or may complete it at any point during their college experience, prior to student teaching.

## Transfer Plan Notes

- Maximum of 65 credits can be transferred to Iowa State University from a community college(s).
- Undergraduates who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 at the beginning of their final term are eligible to graduate "with distinction" provided they have completed 60 semester credits of coursework at Iowa State University at the time they graduate, including a minimum of 50 graded credits.
